Shift descriptions:

Duties they need help with include the following, but can be modified if needed.

1. Help with cook shack (no money handling): running food orders to customers, stocking shelves, setting up the tables and chairs, pull a wagon full of drinks and snacks for customers to buy.

2. Ribbon and prize display set up and delivery of prizes from the opportunity ticket drawing. (Again no money handling)

3. Computer entry inside the booth.

4. Parking lot helper. Direct traffic in the morning and if possible stripping of parking spots before the event at 6:30am.

5. Set up and break down of the event course in the arena (no horses are in the arena)

6. Raking spots in the arena in between events.

7. Gate monitor for incoming and outgoing riders and horses for the events. (Gate operators need to be 18 years old, but helpers can be under the age of 18)

8. Cleanup in the aisleways throughout the day as needed.

Time: 6:30am-4pm and will be split into three shifts. 6:30-10:30am, 10:30am-1pm, and 1-4pm.

One meal will be provided (breakfast or lunch) per day at the snack shack.

Requirements:

The summer months get very hot so it is advised that the volunteers bring **water**, sunscreen and a **hat** in addition to the SLOBs t-shirt, long pants and closed-toe shoes (cowboy boots are great).

Volunteers will need to be calm and observant. No yelling, running or sudden movements are allowed. Volunteers will not be allowed in the arena when any animal is inside. All volunteers will not touch the horses or walk behind them. No horse experience necessary. All volunteer jobs are monitored and supervised by adults.
