Volunteer Safety

General Safety:

- Wear protective gloves.
- Always wear closed-toe shoes to avoid getting scratched by thorns, stubbing your toes on rocks or getting cuts from broken glass.
- Avoid overloading. Don't fill trash bags excessively so that it becomes too heavy to lift.
- Drink lots of water
- Bathroom facilities can be limited near work sites. Always know where the nearest restroom is.
- Hazardous or unidentifiable materials should be left and reported to City staff.
- Beware of hazards: Poison oak, stinging nettle, yellow jackets, mosquitoes, thorns and uneven surfaces.
- Encampments: If a encampment is discovered, please do not disturb occupants or remove any materials.



Poison Oak: Leaves of three, let it be. If you encounter poison oak, wash the area with soap and cold water.



Yellow Jackets: Nest in the ground and are very aggressive. Check your work area thoroughly before any ground disturbance. If you disturb a nest, RUN!

Sharps



Sharps: (hypodermic needles or razors) – Sharps <u>do not</u> go in the trash. Only adults should handle sharps. Place sharps in either a red sharps container or in a plastic bottle with a lid. (Use extreme caution when handling). Make sure the container gets to City staff for proper disposal.
